

PUBLIC HEARING - TO CONSIDER ENACTMENT OF A LOCAL LAW PROVIDING FOR A ONE-YEAR MORATORIUM AND PROHIBITION WITHIN THE TOWN OF PREBLE ON LARGE SCALE PROPANE FACILITIES - NOVEMBER 11, 2013

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE that a public hearing will be held by the Town of Preble Town Board on Monday, November 11, 2013, at 7:45 p.m. at the Town Hall to consider enactment of a local law providing for a one-year moratorium and Prohibition within the Town of Preble on Large Scale Propane Facilities.

PLEASE TAKE FURTHER NOTICE that the environmental significance of said proposed local law will be reviewed at said public hearing.

Any resident of the Town of Preble is entitled to be heard upon said local law at such public hearing. Copies of said proposed local law are available for review at the Town Clerk's Office.

Supervisor Doring opened the public hearing with the reading of the public notice at 7:45 and asked for questions and concerns.

Several residents spoke and thanked the Board for considering the moratorium. Residents are also concerned what other fluids would be in this area.

Darren Fuller, representing a family-owned business (HBDR) took the floor and apologized for not informing the Town of their intentions. He stated that there would be no other fluids involved in this project. He also stated that as this date he has not purchased any land in Preble, but he does plan to purchase the 21 acre land between Route 11 and Route 281.

The residents are concerned about having large storage tanks in our community and the large trucks traveling over the highways, carrying propane.
